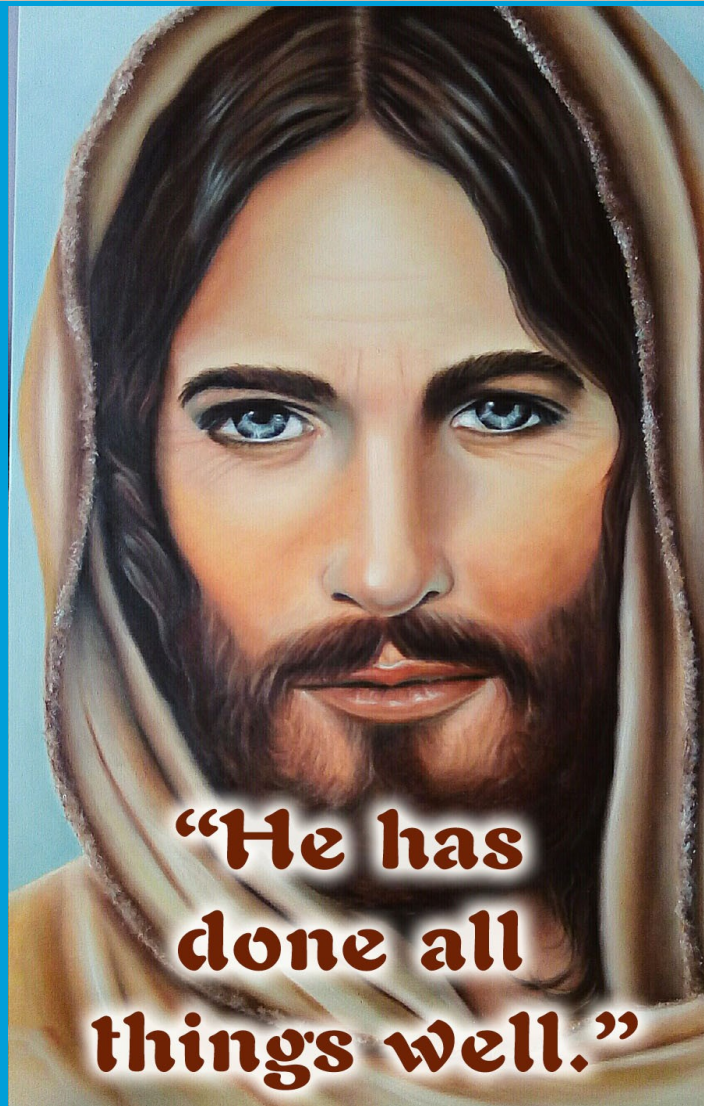

FESTIVAL Update 2024

As all the final numbers have been received and the tally confirmed, we are able to provide the much-anticipated update for this year's Italian Festival on July 20, 2024. First of all, let us offer praise God for the glorious day we received to celebrate our faith and friendship with neighbors and friends from near and far!

The total income generated was \$44,000. This includes income from the raffle tickets of \$15,230, food of \$22,028, 50/50 ticket sales of \$891, and the basket raffle income of \$1,100. Join Our Men's Group!

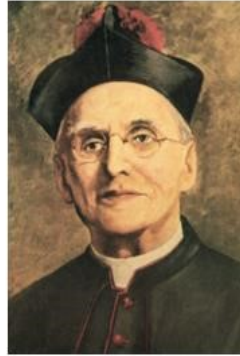
We're excited to begin a new men's faith-sharing group for all adult men in the CNIF family of parishes.

REFLECTIONS

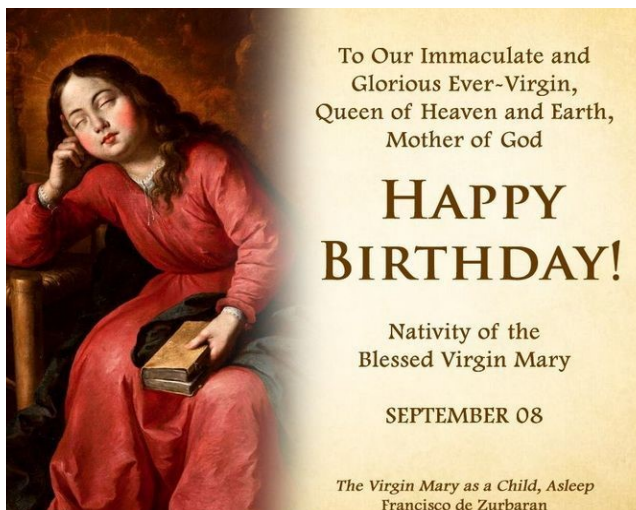
St. James is exaggerating a little when he describes how people might greet visitors or new members in the church. Hopefully, no one was that obvious at treating wealthy members better than poor ones. Sadly, prejudice is a sin that is just as prevalent today as it was 2000 years ago. Today we have laws for business and government to prevent prejudice. But the subtler forms of judging people by their race, clothing, speech, religion, etc. sometimes hide behind patriotism, faith, or the desire to protect our families. So how can we stop it?

One reason for prejudice is ignorance. Some people will believe anything they hear or read, especially if they see it on the internet. When you get an e-mail that says "true Americans" are white, English-speaking Christians, there is probably some prejudice behind it. The only way to fight ignorance is with the truth. Jesus himself said the truth will set you free. (Jn 8:32) He ignored the laws/traditions that said you cannot associate with unclean people, Gentiles, or sinners. He told us that God loves all people, even sinners, so what right do we have to judge someone just because they are different?

A second reason for prejudice is fear. We are told that certain neighborhoods are dangerous. Or an older adult sees three teenage boys walking down the street and because of her fear, she thinks they could be gang members. Sometimes fear stops us from helping the needy. But remember how many times Jesus tells us in the gospels, "Do not be afraid."

If we can learn to see Christ in all peoples, regardless of their race or lifestyle, we are beginning to leave prejudice behind. If we teach our children to respect the poor, the disabled, the homeless, we can help them to understand what James meant about God choosing the "poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom." (Jas 2:5)

Nativity of Mary: Open to God's Grace

Sometimes, God's sense of humor is hard for me to ignore. When I opened my Bible to begin penning this reflection in a quiet adoration chapel, it took all my strength to muffle the involuntary giggle that arose. Why would I find the Gospel heading, "Jesus Cures the Deaf Man" humorous? I was struck by the fascinating "godincidence," as I am the mother of a child who is deaf.

There has been many a Good Friday, as we venerated the Cross, that my family and I have wondered if my daughter would return to the pew miraculously able to hear. Please don't get me wrong, we love her just as she is, and she is the first to tell you this is how God created her and that she loves being deaf! It is not that we want to change her, but being able to hear would make some things much more accessible. Learning about her Catholic faith would be one world we'd love more open to her, and that is precisely the blessing behind the deaf man's miracle.

Today's story of healing goes far beyond providing this man the ability to enjoy listening to singing birds or smooth jazz! No, the greatest gift here is Jesus giving this man the ability to hear the Word of God. He now had the chance to grow in his knowledge of the Messiah, to discover the blessing of living a life yoked to the man who had just healed him, and more importantly, who longed to heal his soul. This life of faith is what Jesus wants for all of us, for our eyes and ears to be open to hearing the Good News and to focus our hearts toward heaven. There are enormous blessings available to everyone who is open to the grace of God, which brings me to why I chose to write for this day in the first place.

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. While we don't know the exact date of Mary's birthday, the Church recognizes that her life is definitely worth celebrating! No one's ears are open wider than Mary's! This woman pondered God's Word in her heart, which allowed her the courage to answer "yes" when the Angel Gabriel asked her if she would allow the Holy Spirit to overshadow her and bring the Savior of the World. That was the power of grace overflowing and active in her life! A little aside: this day was chosen to celebrate Mary's birthday because the early Eastern Church began its Church year in September. This date also helped determine the Church's celebration of the Immaculate Conception on December 8th. Mary's birth is truly a joyous moment and is considered "the dawn of our salvation." (see *Marialis Cultus* by Pope Paul VI). Though it may not be her real birthday, I don't think anyone would take issue with you if you celebrated this momentous day with a cake! By Allison Gingras
