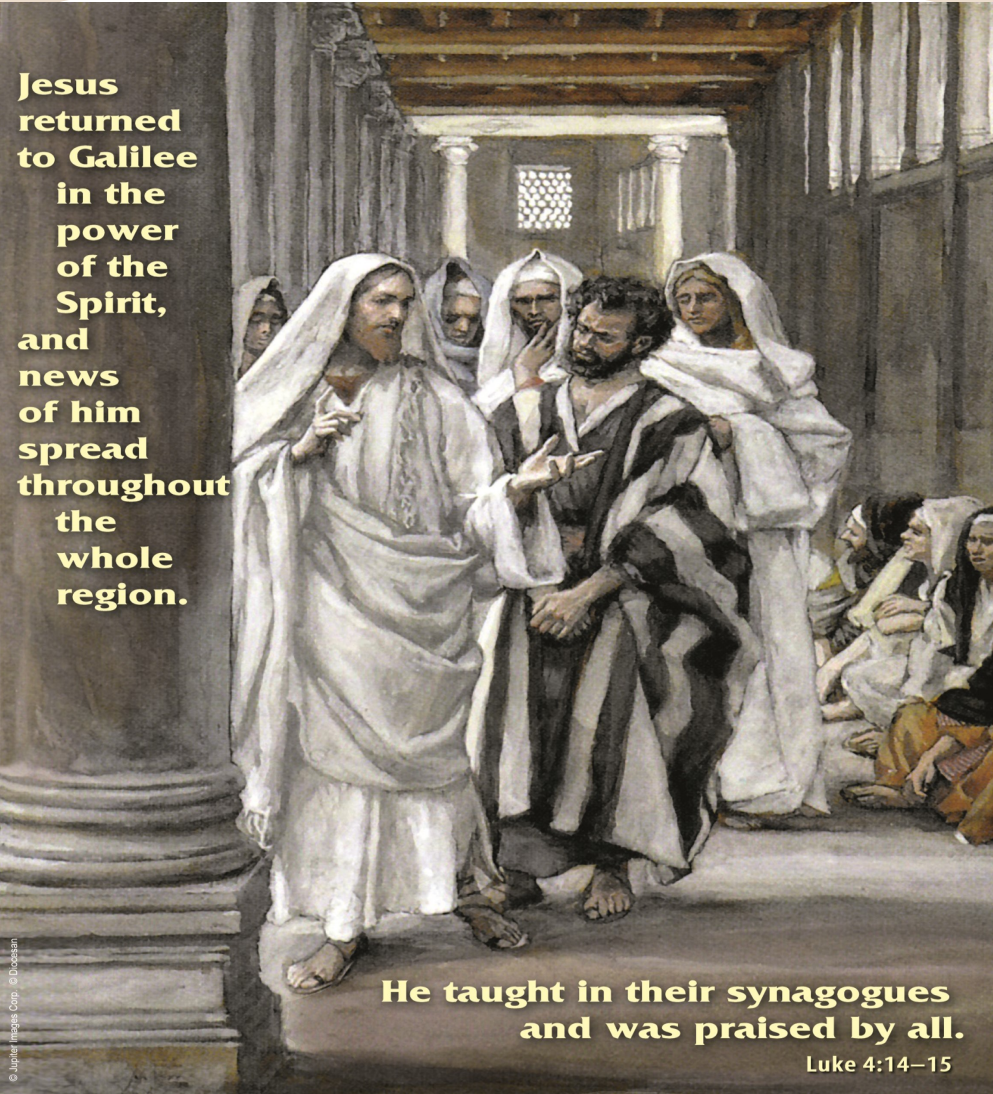

REFLECTIONS

THE WORD IN OUR LIVES

Rejoicing in the Lord

In the first reading, Ezra gets a strange reaction from the people to whom he reads the book of the law. First they lie down, with faces to the ground, and then they all are weeping. Remember the background of this reading. The people of Israel had returned from exile and needed to become a unified nation. Most had never heard the laws, so when they learned what was expected of them and realized how much of the Law they had broken, they wept from shame. Many probably didn't know that they had been breaking the law. Others might have been overwhelmed with all the requirements of the law.

Ezra and Nehemiah console the people by reminding them that their return makes this a day "holy to the Lord" (Nehemiah 8:10). He adds that they would draw strength from "rejoicing in the Lord." That may be good advice for us also.

We might find ourselves so trapped in sin that we think we could never be forgiven. We need to remember that Jesus loved sinners so much that he gave his life on the cross to free us from sin. No sin can be so bad that God's love cannot forgive it. In other words, God's forgiveness is only limited by our failure to ask for it. As the psalms say, God's mercy endures forever. In fact, the more I have to repent, the more God wants to forgive. So we can rejoice in the Lord's forgiveness and the Spirit will give us the strength to change our lives.

And what about those who find the law overwhelming? That usually means a lack of faith in God's willingness to help us or in our ability to do the best we can to live as Christians. It can also be because we have forgotten Jesus' saying that all of God's laws are contained in the command to love God and love our neighbor as we love ourselves. The more we come to accept God's presence in our lives and see God in others, the easier it becomes to keep the law of love. Tom Schmidt

INSPIRATION DAILY

We Are Theophilus

Luke introduces his Gospel with a message to Theophilus. Little is known about this figure, but he was likely an important leader, someone Luke expected to be influential in spreading the word about Jesus. We do know, though, that his Greek name, Theophilus, means "friend of God" or "loved by God." Luke was writing down his account of the life of Christ for a particular person at a particular time in history, but he was also writing for all people throughout time who are loved by God; he was writing for us, for you and me, that we may "realize the certainty of the teachings [we] have received."

After this introduction, today's Gospel reading jumps ahead to Chapter 4. John has recently baptized Jesus in the Jordan, and Jesus has just returned from his 40 days in the desert, where He was tempted. "In the power of the Spirit," the time of his public ministry has come.

Jesus teaches in the synagogues of Galilee to great acclaim. He then continues to his childhood home of Nazareth. He goes to the same synagogue where he has faithfully gone with his family on the sabbath, and they give him the book of the prophet Isaiah to read. It is an honor to read, and Jesus does so with great reverence and respect. He reads from Isaiah: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor ..." After reading, Jesus closes the book, gives it back to the person honored with its care, and sits down. "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing," he says.

We read that a couple thousand years later, and we skim right by it. Yep, Jesus reads Isaiah and says, "This is now," because it was — he's Jesus, Son of God, Savior of the World and all. But imagine that moment in time. He's Jesus, a neighborhood guy, son of Joseph. They grew up with him; they know his family. They know HIM, but something's different. He reads with an authority that gets their attention. They can see it. He finishes, he sits, and all eyes are on him. Silence. Wonder. And in that moment, he tells them: the time has come; the time is now. "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Mic drop in Nazareth.

Sit in that moment for a few minutes. Could they tell? Did they know? The verses that follow suggest that maybe they didn't just yet, but in that moment, what stirred within them? What stirs within us?

Jesus begins his public life among those he loves. Years later, Luke writes the story of that life to Theophilus, loved by God. Two millennia later, we, also loved by God, have the grace of reading the same story, of living the same moment so that we, too, may "realize the certainty of the teachings [we] have received." *Pamela Kavanaugh*

KIDS CORNER

SAINT ANGELA MERICI (c. 1474-1540) January 27

Born in Northern Italy, orphaned in childhood, Angela Merici faced a society in which education was largely the privilege of wealthy young men and based primarily in monastic schools. This reality shaped Angela's insightful conviction that society's disorder was caused by disorder in the home, and a lack of model Christian mothers the result of neglecting the education of young women. Transform the Christian family by placing an educated wife and mother at its heart, Angela believed, and the whole world would be renewed in Christ! So she gathered a small group of unmarried women, many of them Franciscan Tertiaries (lay affiliates) like herself, and set out to educate poor girls, free of charge, in their homes. She and her band of teachers called themselves "companions," pioneering a new form of non-cloistered religious life for women, bearing witness to evangelical simplicity in the midst of the world, not as a formal "order" but as the "Company (compagnia) of Saint Ursula." Known today as the Ursulines, Angela Merici's spiritual daughters continue serving the Church and society in a rich diversity of ministries. Peter Scagnelli
