

Today this material is both a source of strengthened faith for Catholics and understanding for non-Catholics that often leads to their conversion.





Dear Ms. Scalise,

The Dicastery writes in response to your petition for recourse dated 8 March 2025 concerning the suppression of the parish of *Holy Apostles* in Jamestown, by means of an extinctive union with that of the parish of *Saint James* also in Jamestown, both located in the Diocese of Buffalo (cf. *CIC*, canons 121 and 515 §2), according to a decree issued on 6 January 2025, and notified on 9 January, by the Bishop of Buffalo, the Most Reverend Michael W. FISHER.

From the documents provided, it appears that your petition was placed within the peremptory time limits to the correct Dicastery, therefore this curial Institution, in accordance with Art. 137 §1 of the *General Regulations of the Roman Curia*, hereby ACCEPTS it for examination, recognizing as the object the aforementioned decree. In consideration of the public comments by the Diocesan attorney that the resale value of properties was a factor in the decision to decide which parishes would be merged, this Office hereby also GRANTS the requested suspension of the aforementioned act of extinctive merger, for the duration of the recourse (cf. can. 1737, §3).

This Dicastery has placed itself in correspondence with Bishop Fisher and will communicate with you again when his response has been studied.

Do you love me?

In the midst of our Lord's passion, Peter denied knowing Jesus three times. In today's Gospel, we hear Peter affirm his love for Jesus three times. Three denials, three affirmations of love.

St. Augustine commented that Jesus asks Peter three times so that he who had thrice denied through fear might thrice confess through love.

How many times have I, like Peter, denied Jesus through fear? I lead a well-blessed life and I have never feared for my life, but I have denied Jesus through fear. There was the time I was working in an area dominated by another faith and was warned to tuck my crucifix into my sweater so they wouldn't know I was Catholic. I am sad to say, I complied. I have watched something happen that I knew was wrong, but I didn't speak up out of fear of being ridiculed or laughed at. I have seen someone in need, but I told myself it wasn't safe in this day and age to stop and help.

Knowing that I have acted out of fear, I can choose now to act out of love. How do I make this change? How can love overcome fear? In order to be prepared to choose love at the moment of decision, we need to prepare our will to choose the good. This is not something we can consistently do from our own strength or desire. We need to be open to God's grace. We are given all the grace we need to follow Jesus at our baptism, but that grace is like a wrapped gift. We must take the time to unwrap and open the gift in order to enjoy the benefits.

We unwrap the gift of grace when...

we encounter Him in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We can take all of those times we acted out of fear to Him and He will wipe the slate clean. This opens us up to the grace to behave differently in the future.

we humble ourselves to pray on our knees. This gives God's grace the room to work within us. So rather than just mumbling my evening prayers as I drop off to sleep, I can actually kneel by my bed, evoking with my body the humility I desire in my soul.

we practice putting others first. Let someone go ahead of you in line at the grocery store,

let that car in on the highway on ramp, open the door for someone. These tiny, seemingly insignificant acts predispose our will to act in love when the choices are tougher.

Dear Lord, help me today, right now, to turn away from acting in fear and like Peter, choose instead to affirm my love for you over and over. *Sheryl O'Connor*

"Smoting" or Non- "smoting"?

Some times I get angry at things that frustrate me. I'm driving home and traffic slows to a crawl. The electricity goes out while I'm watching a favorite show. So I have to struggle with the line in our first reading, where the disciples were "rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name" (Acts 5:41). They weren't just frustrated; they were flogged for believing in Jesus. And still they rejoiced.

Imagine rejoicing over pain and suffering. These disciples had seen Jesus on the cross. When he rose from the dead, they began to see that his suffering was not a tragic loss, but a sign of his glory. They loved him so much that they took to heart his command to take up the cross. And when they suffered because they believed in him, as is recounted in today's reading, they saw that as a way to imitate Jesus on the cross. Those who had followed him in life could also follow him to the cross—and many did that literally, by dying for their faith.

Most of us today rarely have the chance to die for our faith. We may wonder if we even have the courage it would take. Instead, we usually find ourselves suffering because we have done wrong. God does not use special interventions to smite sinners. Think of the times we were punished as a child. Think of the times we lost a friend because of a cruel remark. Think of the times we got a ticket for speeding. These are the result of our actions. These are sufferings that we would rather avoid.

Jesus, however, suffered for our sins when he was totally innocent. If he could do that, could we not accept suffering for our own sins when it comes? We may not be ready to rejoice in that suffering, but we can at least try to learn from it. If we behave differently because of it, if we can grow to be better persons, then that suffering can be our way of accepting the cross.

Of course, not all suffering is caused by the sins of the person suffering. The suffering of the innocent is a great mystery, a cause for sorrow and a challenge to help where we can. But like growing pains, all suffering is a step to new life in Christ. And that is what Easter is about. *Tom Schmidt*



SAINT DAMIEN JOSEPH DE VEUSTER OF MOLOKA'I (1840-1889) May 10

In the mid-1990s, a heavily bearded, bespectacled Robin Williams appeared on Late Night with David Letterman, whose host was clearly taken aback. Letterman inquired as to why the wild look. Uncharacteristically subdued, the usually manic comic responded that he was producing and starring in a movie about a most extraordinarily compassionate man, Damien, the Leper Priest of Moloka'i.

Some saints transcend religious and ethnic boundaries to touch the heart that beats in each human being: Francis of Assisi; Mother Teresa; and, though Williams' film was never completed, his admiration speaks, as does Damien's statue outside the capitol in Honolulu, of this newest saint's universal appeal. Far from his native Flanders' idyllic beauty and rich culture, Damien volunteered to bear Christ's light into Moloka'i's bleak leper colony, building decent homes, opening schools, establishing clinics, planting farms, sharing the sufferings—and the social stigma—of those with whom he delighted to identify: "We lepers," he would proudly say when finally he contracted leprosy. Saint Damien challenges us to identify the lepers of our own day, to examine our compassion for and our identification with them. Peter Scagnelli


