Inspiration Daily - Let Your Light Shine

In the Gospel reading for today, Jesus, after seeing His crowd of followers, sits down and decides to teach them. Something He saw in the people propelled Jesus to take the time to sit down on the side of a mountain and teach what we would come to know as the Sermon on the Mount. In part of this teaching, Jesus leads the people through a series of statements highlighting the blessings of divine happiness. One of these blessings reveals how deeply Jesus cares about and understands the nature of our human hearts. He desires our holiness so that we might share in the Father's Kingdom with Him. According to Matthew, Jesus says, "Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God."

It is an act of humility to consider the cleanliness of our hearts. But like a smudged window, darkened gradually by grime, our hearts can and do become sullied by sin. This shadowing of heart space can happen subtly, almost imperceptibly. And just as it's hard to see the view through a grime-covered window, it is hard to recognize God at work in our lives when the view from our hearts has become blocked. The light simply struggles to filter in.

In today's first reading, the prophet Zephaniah urges the people to seek God. He speaks of those who see the Lord, a people "humble and lowly," a remnant chosen by God who "shall do no wrong and speak no lies; nor shall there be found in their mouths a deceitful tongue". These, the remnant, are people of a clean heart.

This level of humility is challenging, but today Psalm 146 also assures us the Lord is working for the good of the lowly, for our good, and will keep faith forever. We need not be afraid to consider the state of hearts—the Lord is with us, and in Him we can (and should) take refuge. Paul, too, reminds us in his letter to the people of Corinth that the chosen are called not through any merits of their own, but to fulfill God's mission. Imagine our hearts as magnificent stained glass adorning a cathedral. The more we allow the light to shine through them, the more God's glory is illuminated.

Today, let us make every effort to tend to our whole hearts so that as we seek God, we might also see Him. Just as the simple attention to the task of cleaning a window can make it shine and sparkle, so too that type of attention applied to the care of our own hearts will allow God's light to move through freely. And suddenly the view becomes very clear.

The Word In Our Lives - Boast in the Lord

What are you most proud of? What do you like to boast about? Were you top of your class in college? Are your children the most well-behaved? Do you work harder than anyone in your office? Everyone likes to have something they are the best at, or at least very good. But it really is kind of silly to base your own worth on what you accomplish. What truly makes us important is that we are loved by God. This love begins at our birth, long before we have accomplished anything. Our second reading tells how God uses the foolish, weak, or poorest people to shame those who are wise, strong, and wealthy. Why? Because God loves the poor, the weak, the disabled, the homeless just as much as God loves the important people. And the poor probably love God more than the powerful, rich people do.

And it's not just the external qualities that are important. Some wealthy people have great love for the poor. Some of the best teachers only work with disabled children. My dentist is a very good doctor, but is happiest when he goes to help the poor in Latin America. Our Gospel on the Beatitudes today makes that clear if you listen carefully. Blessed are not just the poor, but the poor in spirit; not only the hungry, but those who hunger for righteousness. That's what Saint Paul means when he says, "Whoever boasts, should boast in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 1:31). In other words, it is not so much what you do, as what God does through you. How much you know is less important than how well you know the Lord. It's not so much where you live, as whether God is living in you.

So how do we get to be "important" to God? Instead of asking God to make my projects a success, I can ask what God wants me to do. Instead of reading every magazine or blog to impress your co-workers with your worldly knowledge, take time to read the scriptures and to listen quietly to the Lord in prayer. Instead of complaining about the government or your parish, try volunteering your time. And for all the good that you do, remember to thank the Lord.

Preparing for Lent

As the Lenten season comes closer, we might ask ourselves how can I prepare for Lent in a more meaningful way. Preparing for Lent involves intentionally focusing on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to grow closer to God, often by choosing realistic spiritual goals like daily Scripture reading, giving up distractions (social media, sweets), or increasing charitable acts, all leading to a deeper, more meaningful experience of the season's purification and reflection. Start by reflecting on what you want to "be" (more prayerful, quiet) and "do" (read, volunteer) and plan manageable habits before Ash Wednesday.

Key Areas for Preparation

Prayer:

- Set a daily habit: Aim for 10-15 minutes of quiet reflection, reading the Gospels, or praying the Rosary.
- Increase frequency: Attend daily Mass if possible or pray the Stations of the Cross on Fridays.
- Deepen prayer: If you already pray, add practices like the Divine Mercy Chaplet or a Holy Hour.

Fasting:

- Beyond food: Give up distractions like TV, social media, or excessive eating, not just for the 40 days but to build lasting habits.
- Be realistic: Choose something challenging but achievable, like eating fewer sweets or skipping takeout once a week.
- Spiritual focus: Frame your fast as penance to turn away from sin and towards Christ.

Almsgiving (Charity):

- **Give generously:** Donate food, clothes, or money to causes you care about.
- **Acts of service:** Volunteer time or perform secret acts of kindness for others.
- **Be intentional:** Make it a conscious effort, not just a public display.

How to Get Started

- Reflect and Decide: Honestly assess your spiritual life and choose one or two specific, manageable goals in prayer, fasting, or almsgiving.
- Plan Ahead: Write down your commitments so you remember them daily.
- Create a Holy Space: Set up reminders in your home, like a purple cloth or a devotional picture.
- Focus on "Being": Aim to be more quiet, thoughtful, and open to God's will, not just checking off a list.
