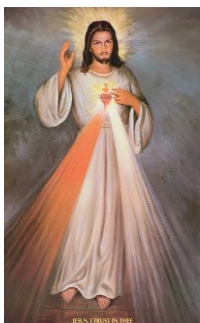

REFLECTIONS

The Word In Our Lives *X-Treme Christians*

You may notice that Acts of the Apostles is the source of the first readings during the Easter season. This book describes how Christianity grew from a handful of disciples to a major religion. Today's reading about an ideal Christian community is meant to show ordinary believers how to be extraordinary, using three examples I call power, property, and prayer. Power means the "signs and wonders" (Acts 2:43) performed by the disciples through the power of the Holy Spirit. This should be named last, because it takes a lot of faith to heal the sick. If you had the same faith as the apostles, you just might be able to cure the sick. Or you might study to become a doctor and cure them with medical skills. As long as you acknowledge that God gave you the brains and the talent to become a doctor, you are doing God's work.

By property, I mean sharing what you have with those in need. Many disciples were moved to sell their goods and share them with the poor, and word of that must have spread. If you are not called to sell all your goods and become a monk or a nun, you can still tithe to your church or the poor. You can donate time as well, perhaps tutoring disadvantaged kids, helping build or repair houses in poor areas, or bringing meals to shut-ins. The point is that followers of Christ are not just individual do-gooders. They are a community of believers who care about each other and also care about the non-believers who need help of any kind.

So where did these first disciples get the faith to cure the sick and the love to help the needy? The answer is the third example—prayer. Twice in the first reading we hear how "they devoted themselves . . . to the breaking of the bread" (Acts 2:42, 46). Breaking bread was their name for the Eucharist. They also went to the temple to pray, because at that time most disciples were Jewish Christians. As they heard the Hebrew scriptures, they saw how God's promises were fulfilled in Christ. Later, they added reading from the letters of Paul and preaching about Jesus' works and teachings. All of these practices helped unite them to Christ and to each other. *Tom Schmidt*

Inspiration Daily *A Well of Mercy*

How I wish I could be Thomas at the moment when Jesus says, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side" (John 20:27). Thomas touched Divine Mercy when he touched Christ's side. Jesus invited him to put his hand into the very wound from which blood and water had flowed.

Jesus' wounds have been transformed. They have been redeemed. They are not simply flesh wounds. They are the wounds of redemption and salvation. They are the wounds of love and mercy, from which grace is poured out to the world.

To St. Faustina, Jesus said, "From all My wounds, like from streams, mercy flows for souls, but the wound in My Heart is the fountain of unfathomable mercy. From this fountain spring all graces for souls.... I desire greatly to pour them out upon souls..." (*Diary of St. Faustina*, #1190).

What surge of love Thomas must have felt as he experienced this mercy! What an intimate encounter he must have had with our Lord! Jesus' glorified wounds are not only transformed, they are transformative. They are not only redeemed, they are redemptive. Thomas' heart must have been on fire as He realized the depths of Christ's love and experienced the transformation and redemption Christ died to give us. With what passion must he have proclaimed, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28)

As with Thomas, often a sudden realization of God's great love and mercy incites our worship and cracks our hearts open as well. By accepting the invitation to bring our doubts, pain, woundedness, and sinfulness to Him, approaching Him and seeing what He has done for us, surrendering ourselves to Him as we do, He can touch our hearts. It is communion with His limitless love that transforms us when we receive Our Lord and offer our hearts as His abode.

In a very powerful way, the wound in Christ's side is the very passageway we are invited to travel to encounter His Heart. His wounds cannot be separated from Divine Mercy, for it is through His suffering and the giving of Himself, through His death and His wounds, especially the wound created by the spear driven into His Heart, that His merciful, redemptive work was released.

We can no longer physically put our hand into Christ's wound as Thomas did. We are called to believe without seeing or touching. But we do have the gift of Divine Mercy and the gift of the Eucharist, in which we can have an equally powerful experience of Christ's love and mercy, of redemption and transformation. This Divine Mercy Sunday, let us come to Our Lord. Let us pray to Him and venerate Him. Let us receive Him into our bodies. And let us cry out in worship and awe together with Thomas, "My Lord and my God!" *Kimberly Andrich*

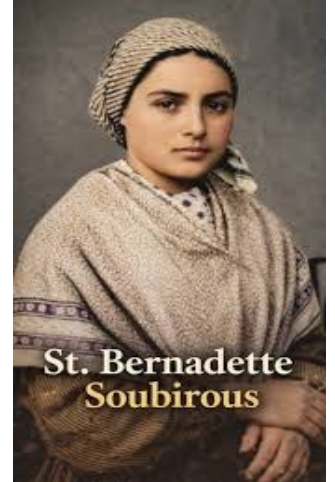

SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT BERNADETTE SOUBIROUS (1844-1879) April 16

With Immaculate Mary's "Ave Maria" for its refrain, Andy Williams' "Village of Saint Bernadette" peaked at #7 on *Billboard's Top 40* at Christmas 1959, airing on radio stations all over America. Imagine! In some dioceses, today marks the feast of Bernardette Soubirous, the teenager who, combing a refuse heap for firewood, saw a "beautiful lady" who identified herself in words Bernadette faithfully reported to the bishop, though she did not understand their meaning: "I am the Immaculate Conception." Relentlessly interrogated, she never wavered in her story or sweetness. Chronically ill all her life and dead at thirty-five, Bernadette left behind the shrine at Lourdes where healing waters still flow from the spring that her "beautiful lady" pointed out to her. 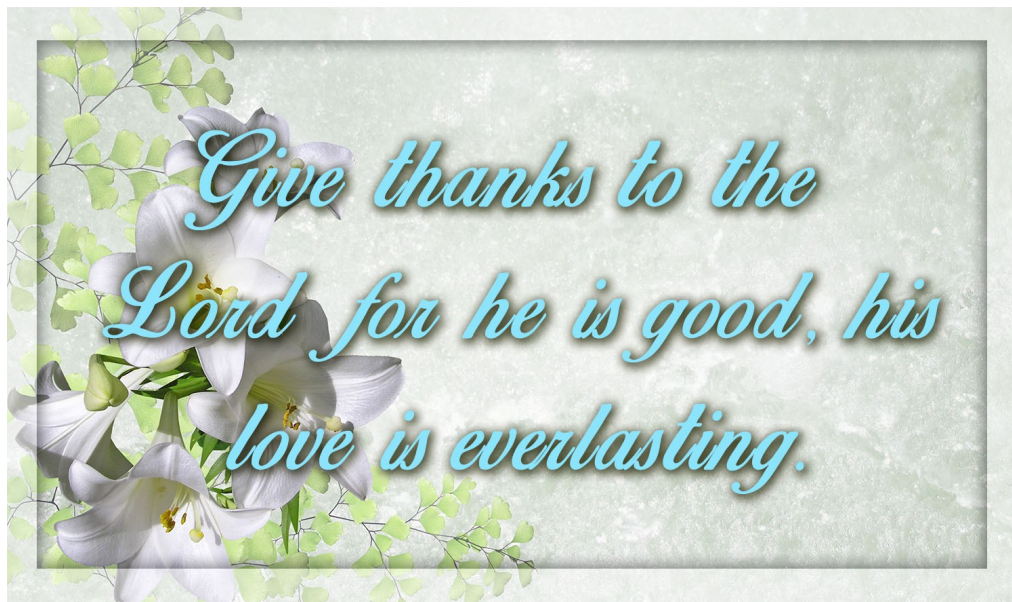


TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION Sunday of Divine Mercy

One of the great Easter traditions is "mystagogy," an ancient word meaning "reflection on the mysteries." It is a style of catechesis, or passing on the faith. People who have shared an experience, in this case those who have been baptized at Easter, are urged to recall their experience, reflect on its meaning, and apply their insights to their new way of life.

There is an aspect of an experience that is simply not available until you've had it. For example, you may think you know weddings inside out; you've been to dozens, seen hundreds in the movies or on television, but until you've said "I do" to another, there is a certain knowledge unavailable to you. Those who go down into the waters of baptism as adults have similar experiences; they have all taken baths before, but not like this one! Mystagogy helps such persons to uncover the deep meaning of the experience, their sense of a new beginning, of God's abundant love, of forgiveness, of community.

It takes time for the power of the Easter Vigil to work its wonders for us. Those who are newly baptized are called "neophytes," meaning "newly planted." The tender buds of spring need care and nurturing, and our new brothers and sisters need your prayer and your faithful example. Rev. James Field

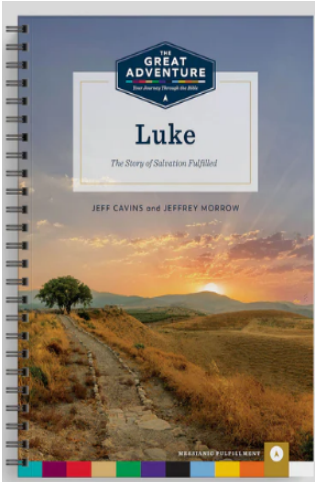

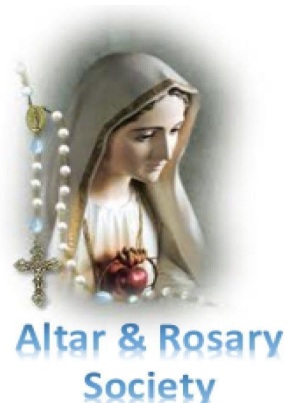
